Forecaster Changes

Pnuemo-C-13: Panorama will now show End of Series (and will not forecast a third dose) for clients who received a first dose of Pnuemo-C-13 under the age of 12 months and then received a second dose at \geq 24 months of age.

Hepatitis B: Forecaster changes have been made to accommodate the 2 dose Hepatitis B program for Grade 6 students. Engerix-B will be supplied for the 2017-2018 school year. Engerix-B has a minimum interval of 24 weeks between the two doses.

Meningococcal B: Clients who received a first dose of Men B vaccine and are between the ages of 2 months to 17 years are now forecasted for up to 2 additional doses (depending on age at first dose) of Men B.


Yellow Fever—Fractional Dose: Due to a world-wide shortage of yellow fever vaccine, some clients are receiving a smaller (“fractional”) dose of the vaccine. The fractional dose offers 1 year of protection, compared to 10 years with the full dose. Panorama now displays Yellow Fever—Fractional Dose as a separate agent in the Immunizing Agents drop down menu.

Mass Immunization Event Closures

Mass Immunization Events (except Influenza Mass Events) should be closed within a month of the event. Closing events in this timely manner will reduce errors when searching for current / open events.

Login Screen Colour Change

Manitoba eHealth is updating security protocols this summer. Once the update is made, users will notice that the background on the Panorama login screen will change from black to green.

Asylum Seekers

Refugee claimants (also known as asylum seekers) who receive public health and immunization services **should be entered into Panorama**. Refugee claimants are eligible for health services, including immunization, until a decision is reached on their asylum claim.

Citizenship and Immigration Canada issues a Unique Client Identifier (UCI) to each refugee claimant. Panorama supports the collection of "Additional IDs" (Client>Client Details>Personal Information). Therefore, the UCI is an Alternate ID for refugee claimants and will be added as the "Citizen/Immigration Identification Number" (under "ID Type" on the Personal Information screen).

Public Health Panorama Users who are providing service to refugee claimants will submit the "Request to Create Refugee Claimant in Panorama" form to the Peer Supporter in their area to create a client record in Panorama. A QRC has been developed for the Peer Supporters.

Panorama users should **confirm at each visit that the Citizen/Immigration Identification Number remains the main client identifier**. Users should always search for refugee claimants using this number and select "Alternate ID" as the "Client Number Type". Records for refugee claimants who do stay in Manitoba will need to be merged with the record created if and when they receive a PHIN. Please notify your Peer Supporter if you encounter any client records that need to be merged.

Naloxone Kits and Adverse Storage Conditions

It has come to our attention that you cannot record an adverse storage condition for a product that requires ambient (room) temperature storage. Naloxone kits are to be stored between 15 and 30°C, so please call the Service Desk for assistance if your kits are inadvertently stored outside this temperature range.

Panorama User Group

This past spring the previous Panorama User groups (Immunization and Inventory, Training, and Reports) were amalgamated into the Panorama User Group. The first meeting was held by teleconference in early April 2017 and invited members from all the previous user groups to put forward names of users who will be willing to provide advice, guidance and feedback on Panorama Immunizations, Inventory, Training and Reports. The next meeting will be booked for September.

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2017-18 Seasonal Flu and Pneumo Immunization Program Reminders

As a reminder from MHSAL, Public Health Offices can start creating their initial flu and/or pneumo vaccine orders in Panorama between August 14th, 2017 and 4:00pm on September 15th, 2017 and saving them in "DRAFT" status.

Draft status is achieved by selecting 'Save Requisition'. DO NOT select 'Submit Requisition'

If Public Health is placing an order on behalf of a Long Term Care Home or hospital, **please create a separate order in Panorama from your own flu/pneumo order** and include a comment stating what location you are ordering on behalf of. Let the Provincial Vaccine Warehouse know the requisition number so that it is sent in accordance with the shipment schedule.

Up-to-date information pertaining to flu vaccine distribution and supply is available on MHSAL's *Seasonal Flu Vaccine Distribution and Supply* website (www.gov.mb.ca/health/flu/distribution.html).

School-based clinics: to reduce the total number of orders going out during flu season and to ensure smooth delivery of routine immunizations during this peak shipping period, MHSAL suggests that **Public Health Offices place their orders for fall school-based clinics in August.**
