**Subject** **Rh Clinic Panorama Go-Live**

---

The Rh Clinic at Women's Hospital will begin using Panorama for Rh surveillance for Canadian Blood Services on June 7, 2018. Rh Clinic staff will document doses of Rh immune globulin (RhIg) given during pregnancy, and those doses will show on the client's immunization profile. Some of the Rh Clinic functions, such as sending appointment letters to pregnant women who are Rh negative, will not be visible to Public Health Panorama users.

On June 4, 2018, Public Health Panorama users will notice that RhIg is added to the immunization agent list. RhIg doses will display on client records after June 7, 2018. Note that the RhIg will **not** display on the MB6800 Immunization Report.

The Panorama forecaster follows the recommendations in the [Canadian Immunization Guide](#), and recognizes the interaction between immune globulins and live vaccines. RhIg was not previously included in the immunization agent list, so this interaction required manual, clinical review. The interaction between RhIg and measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) and/or varicella vaccines is now active in Panorama.

For an optimal response, MMR and/or varicella vaccines should be administered at least 14 days prior to administration of RhIg, or three months later. The forecaster will:

1. invalidate a dose of MMR and/or varicella given in the three months following a dose of RhIg, and
2. invalidate a dose of RhIg if it is given within 14 days after a dose of MMR and/or varicella. Panorama cannot go back and invalidate a dose that has already been recorded, so the subsequent dose of RhIg is invalidated to flag a review of the interaction.

Based on a risk assessment, a dose of MMR and/or varicella vaccine could be given during the interaction period. In these cases, serology is recommended three months after vaccination and revaccination with MMR and/or varicella is recommended if the client is not immune. If serology indicates immunity, the antigens should be manually validated in Panorama.
